

Conflict of Interest Disclosure Statement

All applicants for the position of Editor, *Australian & New Zealand Journal of Psychiatry (ANZJP)* must ensure that their personal interests do not influence, or be seen to influence, their decisions or performance relating to their potential role as Editor. Guidance concerning the duty to disclose conflicts of interest can be found in the College’s guideline for Managing Conflict of Interest available [here](#).

As a part of your nomination, the RANZCP requires you to declare significant relationships and associations which may create conflicts of interest. This is particularly relevant to relationships and associations with the health industry, including the pharmaceutical and higher education sectors.

The purpose of this request for disclosure of potential conflicts of interest is to ensure that any interactions that could be perceived to influence (or that give the appearance of potentially influencing) your potential role as Editor are made known to the College during the application process.

The types of interests and relationships that may need to be disclosed include company directorships or partnerships, financial interests, significant liabilities, gifts, private business, employment, voluntary activities, social or personal relationships that could or could be seen to impact upon the responsibilities of your potential role as Editor. Public funding sources need not be disclosed.
